<ol> <li>On a domain controller open group policy deltor and create a policy for Adblock deployment and assign to the OU that contains the computers you wish to deploy to.</li> <li>Edit the policy, and install the chrome Group Policy template here: http://dl.google.com/dl/edgedl/chrome/policy/policy_templates.zip template file (Right click administrative templates select Add/Remove templates). You need only do this to 1 domain controller. This will provide new Chrome specific GPO settings</li> <li>Enable "Configure User Group policy loopback processing mode:" under Computer Configuration - Policies - Administrative Templates - System - Group Policy. Set mode to merge</li> <li>Under "User Configuration - Policies - Administrative Templates - Classic Administrative Templates - Google Chrome - Extensions" enable policy "Configure the list of force-installed extensions". Under options, click show. Enter the value: chrdojbkjhnklbpkdaibdccddilifdb;https://clients2.google.com/service/update2/crx</li> <li>Click OK.</li> <li>This will disable first run page for Chrome users. Under Computer Configuration - Preferences - Windows Settings - Registry, create new registry item with action "update". Set values as follows: -Hive: HKEY_Local_Machine -Key Path:</li> </ol>
